WALLINGFORD, Conn. – The Connecticut Section PGA Golf Foundation, working in partnership with the Travelers Championship, announced today that ten PGA TOUR professionals will be the guest instructors at junior golf clinics at ten area courses on June 23. The Travelers Championship Pro-Junior Golf Clinics and the TOUR professional appearances are being sponsored by the Foundation. The selected sites were named at the reception following the Walter Lowell PGA Tournament at The Farms Country Club.

Foundation President Frank Selva, Director of Golf at Orange Hills Country Club, was pleased to announce that the following would all be hosting clinics at their course at 2:00 PM on the Wednesday during the Travelers Championship: Ellington Ridge Country Club, Fox Hopyard Golf Club, Indian Hill Country Club, Lake of Isles, Lyman Orchards Golf Course, Rockledge Golf Club, Shuttle Meadow Country Club, Stanley Golf Course, Tallwood Country Club, and the Country Club of Waterbury. Each site will host a 30-minute junior golf clinic followed by a 15-minute autograph session.

“We had tremendous interest from area golf clubs and course and their PGA Professionals to be chosen for this opportunity,” said Selva. “We believe this is rare and unique experience for junior players and are grateful for the generosity of the TOUR players and the Travelers Championship.”

The participating TOUR professionals and the courses that they will be assigned to will be announced the morning of the clinics.
